

Papua New Guinea Visa Application Process


Since the pandemic Tourist Visas cannot be issued on arrival in Port Moresby. The only way to get a visa an online application for

“Easy Visitor Permit 30 days”

Easy Visitor Permit (30 days)

This visa is for individual who intent to visit Papua New Guinea for holidays, sightseeing, social or recreational reason:

There is no Migration Service Fee (MSF) payable for the Visitor Permit, however, applications lodged via the e-Visa pc

This visa expressly prohibits the holder from engaging in paid work.

Once you start the application process you will see the following

Requirements to lodge application

Search for type of visa required and confirm visa requirements	Register to allow notification and enter application	Submit Application	Issue confirmation
Applicants search for the type of visa needed for their trip. Applicants are informed if they can apply online and what documents will be required.	Applicants register by providing an email address and confirm it is correct. Applicants then enter all the required application details.	After completing the details and uploading the required documents, the application is ready to be submitted. The visa fee must then be paid before the application is automatically submitted.	Once the visa fee is paid a receipt email is sent. If the application is automatically granted, an email will be sent containing an authority to travel document. If the application requires further consideration, an email will be sent with the final decision.

The following documents need to be provided before the application can be lodged:

- Copy of Passport Bio page
- Corona Virus Medical Clearance Certificate
- Cover Letter - (purpose, visit site, accomand contact details)
- Evidence Of Funds
- Complete Corona Virus Supplementary Heath Form

Please note that all files submitted must be either .jpg (photo) or .pdf (documents)

Iphone users note If you are taking photo of Passport Pages with iphone you will need to manually save the photo in .jpg format instead of the iphon default Heic image format

NB: Where it requests Coronovirus medical clearance certificate, you can submit either a pdf copy of you vaccination certificate or just a pdf letter saying you have not been vaccinated. There is no requirement to be vaccinated to enter PNG or obtain an evisa

Please note if you have previously tried to apply for an evisa – you will need to ‘request a new password and sign in again. There has been problems reported with the old sign in and it gets stuck – so just get a new one and sign in again.





To make the application you will need to be signed in – the application page will look like this with your logged in account and application in the column on the left

You will be asked to upload documents at some stages. These can be either .jpg or pdf format. The application process only check that something has been uploaded, it will not check the validity of the uploads before the evisa is issued electronically

The evisa is sent as an email with a pdf document to the applicant. It will list Applicant name, Nationality, Passport number and evisa reference number. We recommend keeping a copy of this document with you when you travel to PNG. On arrival at immigration in Port Moresby the details of your application will be checked against your Passport and other travel documents.
